#### Presenter: 2\*Paul\*

Hello,.... I got your message. I see you are pondering on a question that many people have trouble answering. I've invited some friends to share with you how we managed to discover our purpose.

Your purpose may be discovered by answering a call.

Beware of answering the wrong call and be careful how you respond to it.

Presenter 1: But why? I just answered your call, didn't I?

#### Presenter 2:

Yes, you did, but I kind of answered the wrong call when I was younger. You're blessed you have the word to help you these days. I answered a call that I believed was my purpose and look at what my actions resulted in. I brought pain, misery, and anguish to many believers of Christ because I believed that I had found my purpose and that I was doing the right thing in destroying the church of God.

It was only after I met Jesus on the road to Damascus that I found my true purpose. Only God can give you clarity of purpose,

#### "Your word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light to my path." (Psalm 119:105)

By listening to the word of God I knew that my purpose was to spread the gospel to all the people of the world.

Through my purpose many barriers were overcome. For example, because of my background I was better equipped to interact with elite during my time than many of the disciples who followed Christ.

Today you read my teachings about Christ and God's love thousands of years later.

So, you see answering just any call is not good enough, you must answer the right call.

The world has many callers many aligned with the devil. If we do not guard our hearts, we will be called to the world.

Always be ready to answer when God calls you because your purpose will change with time and circumstances. Ask my fellow believer, **the Little slave girl she'll tell you**.

#### Presenter 3 \* The Little slave girl \*

Hi guys! It's very true that because of circumstances beyond our control you might feel that you are without a purpose.

Back then I had lost everything because of war. I was in a strange place and as a slave I had lost my autonomy as a person. I could not make any decisions about my life followed orders. Yet in all that I can honestly say that I still found my true purpose. God gave me a purpose of sharing His love with my captors. I remember how terrified I was of my masters. I could barely speak!

Despite my circumstances, I realized that I had to speak up because God wants to relieve us of our suffering. I had to share that I knew about the power of God and the great things that he can do.

I know that when your freedom to do what you want, whenever you want is taken away you tend to feel that you have no voice too. Rest assured that God will reveal your true purpose even then. I mean did you hear what Esther did. She could have been killed. Right Esther?

#### Presenter 4\*Esther\*

Let me just say, my knees knocked against each other that day when I appeared before the King. It was a time of fear and uncertainty. There were forces at work trying to destroy my whole tribe, you know the story. All I can say is your true purpose will find you wherever you are. You must be willing to listen and heed the call when the time comes. There will be many distractions around you many calls to focus on other things. Trust me, most of the girls who went with me to the King's palace were more concerned about their beauty regiments and their appearance than about saving our people.

My true purpose required me to be brave to do something unconventional, because it had to be done. I had to put my life on the line to fulfil my purpose. Some people hated me because of my true purpose. I trusted that God was in charge and He would take care of everything else.

"He leads me beside the still waters. He restores my soul. He leads me in paths of righteousness for His name's sake." (Psalm 23:2-3) 11 1 only did what I was meant to do with the resources available to me. I had a platform that only I could utilize. I made sure to use it to the best of my abilities. Sometimes doing what you are capable of is all you need to fulfil your purpose, because God will put you in the perfect position to find your purpose. #### WHERE HE LEADS I WILL GO

All of us are different with different purposes and your particular gift and experience is there to help make the world a better place.

How willing is your heart to go where God leads? How receptive are your ears to the voice of God? How tuned in is your spirit to the Holy Spirit of God? How sure are you that you are, where God intended for you to be?

"But I protested, 'Oh no, Lord, GOD! Look, I don't know how to speak since I am only a youth" (Jer. 1:6). Jeremiah felt inadequate as a public speaker. By the way, this excuse was shared by Moses (Ex. 4:10).

Being young sometimes gives us the false hope that we will be around forever. We put off the things of God for later. We put off important decisions to have fun and do what we call "enjoying our youth"

Today we must realize that although we are not marching across a desert like the Israelites or fighting battles with the Philistines, we are still fighting the inward battle to follow God no matter how hard or how much it costs.

"I chose you before I formed you in the womb; I set you apart before you were born" (Jer. 1:5). The verb know has much more meaning than simply being aware of. It carries the idea of recognition of the worth and purpose of him who is known. God knew Jeremiah, chose Jeremiah, and appointed Jeremiah. He was known by name, hand-picked by God, and commissioned to serve. Those acts give one a great sense of purpose. The promise of God's purpose allows us to let go of our own plans and to receive God's plan without fear. Like Jeremiah and Jesus, we need to accept that our future is not our own. We are God's. He has a distinct plan and purpose for our lives.

In the Christian world, we can find all sorts of excuses not to obey God's voice or to follow where He leads: "It's the preacher's job." "It's not my gift." "I've already served, let someone else do it." "I'm too busy or too tired or too old or too young." It has been said, "Excuses are tools of the incompetent, and those who specialize in them seldom go far." Ben Franklin wrote, "He that is good for making excuses is seldom good for anything else." Gabriel Meurier stated, "He who excuses himself, accuses himself."

God has a way to overcome weakness and our insufficiencies, doesn't he? I have learned over the years, however, that the person most aware of his own inadequacy is usually the person most dependent on God's all-sufficiency. My inadequacy has caused me to rely upon God. His strength is made perfect in my weakness. His glory is manifested through my flaws.

There is absolutely nothing we cannot achieve if God is with us.

Has God given you a gift?

An ability that can be used to glorify His name and help others? Has God been making you question your decisions lately? Have you been wondering what is it that makes you unique? Have you been dwelling on the fact that there must be more to life?

There is more to life!

Deuteronomy 28:13

And the Lord shall make thee the head, and not the tail; and thou shalt be above only, and thou shalt not be beneath, if thou hearken unto the commandments of the Lord thy God which I command thee this day, to observe and to do them.

Do you want to be the head and not the tail? It is within your reach.

BUT there are some things you need to do in order to reach your best potential and fulfil whatever Godly quest has been set before you were even born.

HEARKEN unto the commandments of the Lord thy God this day. Not tomorrow not next week. This day. Observe and Do them.

Our talent may at times even appear inadequate, but God always equipped His children. We have the promise of God's provision. "Then the LORD reached out His hand, touched my mouth, and told me: I have now filled your mouth with My words" (Jer. 1:9).

#### INTRODUCTION

Lydia is mentioned in only two short passages in the Bible, both in the book of Acts, but what is said tells us a lot about her.

Lydia is the first woman named in Scripture who is described as a retailer. She was a successful businesswoman. Her name originally might have been the designation of her home. She came from Thyatira, a city in the western part of Lydia in Asia Minor.

Lydia's life reveals to us a God who longs for a relationship with His people.

#### Questions for Discussion

 Some of the women we study in these lessons were maids, servants, or very poor. In contrast, Lydia was a successful business woman. What are some of the advantages each of these two categories has? What are some problems or temptations that might come to each group?

2. Assuming she has the ability, would you encourage a woman to become a businessperson? Why, or why not?

#### Words of Wisdom

1 Peter 4:9 (NIV) reminds us to "offer hospitality to one another without grumbling."

Ellen White gives us a reason to ponder true hospitality: "Even among those who profess to be Christians, true hospitality is little exercised. Among our own people the opportunity of showing hospitality is not regarded as it should be, as a privilege and a blessing. There is altogether too little sociability, too little of a disposition to make room for two or three more at the family board without embarrassment or parade. Some plead that 'it is too much trouble.' It would not be if you would say, We have made no special preparation but you are welcome to what we have.' By the unexpected guest a welcome is appreciated far more than in the most elaborate preparation" (Testimonies for the Church, vol. 6, p. 343).

"Pleasant voices, gentle manners, and sincere affection that finds expression in all the actions, together with industry, neatness, and economy, make even a hovel the happiest of homes. The Creator regards such a home with approbation" (Signs of the Times, Oct. 2, 1884).

Our Savior is pleased when we extend hospitality to all. Lydia did not allow her business to interfere with opening her home to others.
